LIBRARY TO USE COLLECTION AGENCY

The Library Board enacted a policy to use a collection agency to help encourage patrons with overdue materials to return them to the library. The cost of this service will be passed on to each patron whose account will be handled by the collection agency.

This new policy was developed with fairness to all Library patrons in mind. Materials not returned are not available for others to use or borrow. Also, if materials are not returned, in most cases, money from the Library budget is used to replace them. This same money could be better used to purchase new items for patron use instead of replacing non-returned items. If you have any questions, please contact the Director at 223-6228.

LearningExpressLibrary

All practice tests include instant score reports that help you target those skill areas that need the most attention. You will be asked to create a user name and password; use your Baldwin Library Card barcode number as your user name and make up any password you like. This will allow you to save your work and track your progress.
