Introducing Two New Databases to Help Students Ace Their Assignments

Science in Context (from Gale) features authoritative information for research and projects with deep coverage from the earth, physical and life sciences to space, technology, mathematics, science history and biography. More than 22,000 topic overviews, 7,000 biographies and 1.5 million articles are drawn from reference sets and noted publications. Additionally, **Science in Context** has 16,000 images and videos and nearly 200 detailed experiments to help bring concepts alive.

History Reference Center (from EBSCO) covers U.S. and world history from ancient times to present. Along with content from over 2,000 reference works and 170 leading periodicals, the database contains nearly 57,000 historical documents, more than 79,000 biographies, thousands of photos and maps, and more than 80 hours of video. Rich in primary source material such as speeches, Supreme Court decisions, legal and other historical documents, **History Reference Center** allows users to get closer to history.
